Dear Friends,

I have good news to share. At least I hope it STAYS good news. Some of you may have already heard this, but it doesn't hurt to hear good news multiple times. WE CAN GET BACK IN OUR BUILDING FOR SUNDAY WORSHIP! We've been given guidelines from the Diocese about how to keep our gatherings as safe as possible. Neil Hargrave is gathering a team to give everything in the sanctuary a going over. We have masks and are adjusting our seating to keep everyone as safe as possible. And I'm keeping an eye on the Covid stats for Lapeer County to assure us all that we're not experiencing an uptick of infection. We're hoping you will be able to join us on Sunday, July 19th at 10AM for a service filled with alleluias and praise.

Another piece of good news — Deacon Tom Manney will be joining us at St. John's as a "curate". He will be leading worship on the first and third Sundays of each month, will have office hours and will assume other pastoral duties. The even better news — Tom is scheduled to be

ordained a priest on July 18^{th} – just before his first service, his first Eu-



charist ever, with us on the 19th. Now, if I've learned anything this year, it is to manage my expectations. The ordination date may change or it may become unsafe to gather at church. But at this moment, this looks like a wonderful convergence of events for both Tom and for us.

We understand that some will feel more safe staying home for a while longer. OK – how about this? We're experimenting with recording and possibly live-streaming our service from the sanctuary! For those with access to the internet, it will bring us to you in a way that we haven't achieved so far.

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

We are glad to formally announce a shift into Phase II of our congregational in-person re-opening and issue some changes to the existing "Plan for Re-Entry for Great Lakes Episcopalians" document, which is linked below.

All faith communities will be able to re-enter their buildings under Phase II directives on June 29th. The first in-person worship services may take place on Sunday, July 5th.

As stated previously, congregations may choose for themselves whether to reopen on that date, delay their reopening, or not open at all until Phase III.

Additionally, the four dioceses have made a few changes to the reopening document, including a major change to Phase II based on feedback from parish and diocesan leaders, further research, and discussion with groups assembled by the dioceses. Understanding that many congregations have made preliminary plans based on the original document, we want to acknowledge your hard work and careful planning and encourage you to live into those plans and make adaptations over time as you learn what might be appropriate for your local context.

Eucharist will be permissible during Phase II, following strict rules and recommendations. The celebration of Eucharist is completely optional and congregations may choose to continue Morning Prayer. This section also makes provision for Eucharistic visitation.

Capacity limits have been modified for indoor gatherings and clarified for outdoor gatherings.

Indoor limits have shifted from 50 persons to 25% of your room capacity, or the maximum number of peo-

ple for the space while maintaining six feet of distance, whichever is fewer.

The outdoor limit is based on the maximum number approved by the state at the time of gathering (currently, this number is 100 persons) or the maximum number of people for the space while maintaining six feet of distance, whichever is fewer.

A new section is included in the document to give guidance on managing the reporting process and internal/external communication should someone become infected who had entered your building or attended a church-sponsored event.

The plan includes new guidance around the use of gloves. Based on research from epidemiologists, gloves should only be used in food preparation and are not as effective as handwashing and sanitizer for virus prevention.

Because our dioceses are in a strange season due to the one-year suspension of the bishop, it is important to note that this conversation, including the dates and the plan changes, has been in-process for several weeks. In the beginnings of this planning with the other dioceses, the discussions included Bishop Hougland with Canon Katie Forsyth, in consultation with other staff and elected diocesan leadership. In the past week, since Bishop Hougland's departure, the Standing Committee designated Canon Forsyth as our advocate in the discussion and has formally approved the new date and the changes to the phase plan by unanimous vote. We will continue to be a part of discussions and decision-making with the other Michigan dioceses as we move forward.



Use the back door on the side of the building to enter!




This is what the front of the church looks like (but there are leaves on the trees now)
